1965	Hayzel B. Daniels, the first African American lawyer in Arizona, becomes the first African American appointed judge in Arizona.
1970s	The Arizona Women's Lawyer Association is formed.
1971	The Arizona Black Bar is founded.
1976	Los Abogados is founded as an informal association of lawyers and law students with the goal of empowering Latinos within the legal profession.
1976	Navajo Nation judges create the Navajo Nation Bar Association.
1980	The Arizona Women's Lawyer Association formally incorporates.
1988	Los Abogados formally incorporates and creates the Honorable Valdemar A. Cordova Scholarship in honor of Arizona's first Latino federal judge.
1991	Arizona Minority Bar Association hosts first successful Scholarship Banquet.
1993	The Arizona Asian American Bar Association is founded.
1996	The Arizona Asian American Bar Association hold their first fundraiser banquet.
2000	The Iranian American Bar Association is formed in the District of Columbia.
2001	The Arizona Asian American Bar Association hosts the National Asian Pacific American Bar Association Convention.
2007	The Native American Bar Association of Arizona is founded.
2009	The Native American Bar Association of Arizona hosts its first Seven Generations Dinner.
2010	The Arizona Jewish Lawyer's Association holds its first meeting.
2011	The Arizona Jewish Lawyer's Association hosts its first networking happy hour.
2015	The LGBTQ+ Bar Association of Arizona is formally established. The Arizona Black Bar presents its first Excellence in Diversity Awards.
2017	Los Abogados launches the LSAT Fellowship Program. The South Asian Bar Association of Arizona formally incorporates.
2023	Benjamin Taylor becomes the first African American State Bar of Arizona President. The South Asian Bar Association of Arizona hosts its first annual Diwali event.
2024	The Iranian American Bar Association Phoenix Chapter hosts its first annual gala.
