CEO's Report – Joel England

- Introduced:
 - Employee of the 4th Quarter Jennifer Sonier, Professional Development Director
 - Employee of the Year Caitlin Kelly, Program Coordinator in the Legal Services Division
- Attended same events as President Sanchez
- SB 1092 introduced; the State Bar and Supreme Court may not infringe or impede "the political speech rights of any attorney or the attorney's clients"
- Staff updates:
 - New HR Director starts on January 30
 - ➤ CFO Kathy Gerhart to begin phasing out career at the Bar; Controller Jessica Iennarella will become Deputy CFO in April, train extensively on CFO responsibilities not currently handled, and become CFO at yearend

Proposed Amendments to the SBA Articles of Incorporation – Lisa Panahi

• The Bar's Articles of Incorporation were filed in 1987 and needed to be reviewed.

- Some general language clean-up was proposed but Article VII, which deals with the dissolution of the corporation, would be changed to allow the assets to also be distributed to a 501(c)(6), whereas the current Articles only mention assets being distributed to a 501(c)(3).
- Notice was given to the Board at the December meeting that the proposed amendments would be voted on at this meeting; no comments/feedback were received.
- **MOTION**: David Rosenbaum moved, Eric Ruchensky seconded and the motion carried unanimously to approve the proposed amendments to the SBA Articles of Incorporation.

<u>Finance and Audit Committee</u> – Jessica Iennarella

- Currently anticipating a surplus for the year of \$1,554K relative to a budgeted surplus of \$389K – excluding investment activity.
 - Revenues Anticipate \$712K favorable variance Variance primarily driven by increased CLE revenue, advertising sales and rental income
 - Expenses Anticipate \$453K favorable variance Variance primarily driven by lower bank fees and personnel costs
- December financial statements will be issued in two phases. Preliminary will be issued January 31st. Final, including year-end adjustments, will be out around end of February.
